■About Australian National Rugby Union Team, nicknamed the Wallabies

The Wallabies are Australia's national men's Rugby Union team. Their first ever match was against a touring British team in 1899 at the Sydney Cricket Ground when they claimed victory 13-3. Since 1899 the Wallabies have played 618 international Tests, winning 316 with a percentage rate of 51.13%. Their biggest victory was during the 2003 Rugby World Cup when the men in gold defeated Namibia 142-0. The Wallabies

have competed in eight Rugby World Cups and were crowned champions in 1991 and 1999, and played in the final in 2003 and 2015. The next World Cup will be held in Japan in 2019. The current Head Coach of the Wallabies is Michael Cheika who has been in the role since 2014. The current Captain of the Wallabies is Michael Hooper who has played 79 tests for Australia. The Wallabies are currently ranked fourth in the World Rugby Rankings, behind New Zealand, Ireland and England.
